

This year's accomplishments reflect the vibrancy, creativity, and unity that define our community. a community that honors its roots while looking confidently toward the future.

In 2024–25, Farhang's mission reached new heights. #### **Expanding Our Reach:** A New Era for Farhana

This past year marked a historic milestone for Farhang Foundation with our long-anticipated debut in Northern California. Our collaboration with the Yerba Buena Center for the Arts (YBCA) in San Francisco introduced Farhang's programming to an entirely new audience through two remarkable solo exhibitions: Nicky Nodioumi: The Personal Is Political and Nahid Hagigat: Etched in Time. These exhibitions explored the intersection of identity, politics, and creativity, engaging thousands of visitors and drawing widespread acclaim.



Complementing these exhibitions, Farhana hosted a series of public talks and panels, including **Art of Resistance**, featuring Iranian artists Dr. Shiva Ahmadi, Ala Ebtekar, Taraneh Hemami, and Dr. Talinn Grigor. The sold-out discussion exemplified the ways in which Iranian social change and cultural dialogue. A follow-up conversation between renowned painter Nicky Nodjoumi and scholar Dr. Layla S. Diba became worldwide.

#### **Celebrating Nowruz:** A Season of Renewal

At the core of our cultural calendar stands Nowruz, a celebration of rebirth, beauty, and unity. On March 9, 2025, Farhana Foundation proudly hosted its 15th Annual Nowruz Celebration at UCLA, the largest Nowruz gathering in the United States. More than thirty thousand visitors filled Dickson Court Park for a day of live music. traditional dance, storytelling, and children's activities, crowned by our magnificent grand Haft-Sîn display and a free outdoor concert by the one and only Kamyar.

Farhang extended the Nowruz spirit to the broader community through our Grand Haft-Sîn installation at Westfield Century City, accompanied for the first time by a full day of live music and dance. We then concluded the Nowruz season with our annual Pacific Symphony collaboration at the Renée and Henry Segerstrom Concert Hall in Orange County. The sold-out concert, **Return of the Masters**, featured the leaendary Pournazeri Trio: Kaykhosro. Tahmoures, and Sohrab, joined by Sahar Boroujerdi, Donya Kamali, and Tina Jamegarmi. Under the direction of Maestro Carl St.Clair, the evening embodied Farhang's mission of celebrating Iranian heritage through world-class artistry.



Online, Farhang's global reach continued to arow. New episodes of Farhana Performances and Farhang Flavor brought Iranian music and That evening, the festivities continued with our cuisine to audiences in more than thirty countries, with highlights including Gordafarid's Atash-e Nowruz, the children's program Parvaz Keykavos, and Yazdi chef Elaheh Mirafzali's beloved recipe for **Qottab Yazdi** 

#### A Year of Film, Theater, and the Performing Arts

Farhang Foundation continued to champion Iranian cinema, sponsoring all Iranian films in competition at AFI FEST, America's largest film festival. These screenings included the highly anticipated **The Seed of the Sacred Fia** by Mohammad Rasoulof, My Favourite Cake by Maryam Moghadam and Behtash Sanaeeha, and Universal Language by Matthew Rankin. The festival's enthusiastic audiences reaffirmed the growing global recognition of Iranian filmmakers and Farhang's pivotal role in elevating their voices on international stages.



Our longstanding partnership with the UCLA Film and Television Archive also flourished through the Celebration of Iranian Cinema, presenting a diverse range of films and the historic restoration of **The Sealed Soil** by pioneering director **Marva** Nabili. This remarkable rediscovery, the first Iranian feature film directed by a woman, stood as a tribute to Iranian cinema's enduring legacy.

In the performing arts, Farhang's collaboration with the Center for the Art of Performance UCLA (CAP UCLA) brought two powerful theatrical productions to Westwood's Nimov Theater. Tara Ahmadinejad's Disclaimer offered a witty exploration of communication and identity, while Sussan Deyhim's Whispers from the Underworld captivated audiences with its transcendent blend of music, dance, and visual storytelling.



Meanwhile, our partnership with the Alex Theatre Performing Arts Center in Glendale reached a new high point with the sold-out Pallet Concert on April 27, 2024. This electrifying performance marked the beloved Iranian band's long-awaited return to Southern California after more than eight years and strengthened our commitment to engaging Eastside audiences and the vibrant Iranian Armenian community.



#### **Preserving Musical Heritage** and Inspiring New Generations

Music has always been at the heart of Farhang Foundation's mission, and this year we continued to nurture both established and emerging talent. Our collaboration with Maestro Shardad Rohani and the newly founded Roudaki Orchestra brought historic concerts to both UCLA's Schoenberg Hall and UCI's Irvine Barclay Theatre. The performances, part of the orchestra's inaugural season, featured new compositions blending classical orchestration with Iranian melodies, redefining the boundaries of Iranian symphonic music.



Equally inspiring was the Annual Music of Iran Concert at UCLA's Herb Alpert School of Music, organized by the Iranian Music Program, a program made possible through Farhang's support. This event provides students of diverse backgrounds with the opportunity to study and perform traditional Iranian repertoire under the mentorship of world-class musicians. Watching

these young artists carry forward our musical **Building Bridges Through** heritage reminds us that Farhang's investment in education is an investment in the future.

#### Literature, Learning, and Thought Leadership

Farhang's dedication to scholarship and storytelling continued through the Farhang Literature series, which launched with Martyr! by Kaveh Akbar in conversation with Abdi Nazemian, followed by The Lion Women of Tehran by Marjan Kamali. These deeply engaging discussions attracted tens of thousands of viewers and positioned the program as a cornerstone of our digital offerings.

Our **USC Distinguished Lecture Series** welcomed Dr. Pamela Karimi for an inspiring talk on Survival by Design: Desert Architecture at the End of the World, exploring sustainability and cultural resilience. At **UC Santa Barbara**, the annual **Iranian** Studies Lecture Series featured Dr. Ali Mirsepassi and **Dr. Soraya Tremayne**, both offering timely analyses of Iranian social and cultural identity.

#### Traditions Celebrated: The 12th Annual Celebration of Shab-e Yalda

Before the arrival of the New Year, Farhana closed 2024 with one of its most cherished traditions, the 12th Annual Celebration of Shab-e Yalda. Hosted for the first time at the Wallis Annenberg **Center for the Performing** Arts in Beverly Hills, this sold-out event celebrated the longest night of the year through poetry, music, and storytelling. The evening featured Iran's pioneering female Naggal, Gordafarid, alongside the Siriya **Ensemble** and **Sheenubb** in their unforgettable US debut performance. With its fusion of southern rhythms and classical narration, the night captured the very essence of Iranian artistry and community spirit.



#### Community and Culture

From the Festival Beverly Hills to Iran Through **Books** at the Los Angeles Times Festival of Books, Farhang continued to foster community engagement and cross-cultural understanding. Tens of thousands of visitors encountered Iranian art and culture through music, dance, literature,



Through these initiatives, Farhana remains not only a presenter of art but a bridge between generations and communities, inspiring a deeper appreciation of the values that unite us all.

This multidisciplinary performance brought to life the ancient Iranian epic, the *Shahnameh*, through the use of over 480 handmade puppets, projected animation, music, movement, and theater. The production featured an original score by Loga Ramin Torkian, with vocals by Azam Ali, and included ensemble members Ray Dondero, Sam Jay Gold, Harrison Greene, J Hann, Esme Roszel, Mo Talani, Sarah Walsh, Clay Westman, and Christopher Williams. Described by Le Monde as bursting with "breathtaking fireworks of creativity," the show celebrated culture, collaboration, and the enduring power of storytelling.

In April 2024 Farhang Foundation, in collaboration with **Craft Contemporary** in Los Angeles, presented a series of unique cultural programs that engaged audiences through sound, art, music, and hands-on creativity. These programs were all presented as part of the **ART IRAN** exhibition, which launched at Craft Contemporary in January 2023 and ran through May 2024.

On April 13 the journey began with a Sound Healing Experience with **Roxie Sarhangi**, a seventy-five-minute immersive sound bath featuring the resonant tones of seven crystal bowls, a symphonic gong, an ocean drum, kochi chimes, and more, woven together with the wisdom of Rumi. Guided by Los Angeles-based artist and sound healing practitioner Roxie Sarhangi, participants were invited to bring yoga mats, pillows, and blankets to fully embrace this meditative and restorative session.

On April 21 the Foundation hosted a multifaceted cultural event that began with an insightful curator walk-through by **Roshanak Ghezelbash**, offering deeper understanding of the exhibited works. The program continued with the **CHAHAR BAGH** musical performance, inspired by the traditional Iranian "Four Gardens" design symbolizing harmony and balance. The ensemble featured vocalist **Maliheh Moradi**, composer and santoor player **Ehsan Matoori**, sitarist **Rajib Karmakar**, and percussionist **Greg Ellis**, captivating the audience with compositions by Matoori and Karmakar.

The series concluded on April 25 with **CERAMIC POMEGRANATES: A WORKSHOP WITH POT STUDIO**, a hands-on experience inspired by ART IRAN. Participants of all skill levels explored the art of hand-building and shaping clay into pomegranates, learning surface and underglaze decoration techniques along the way. Materials and tools were provided, ensuring an accessible and creative session for both beginners and experienced enthusiasts alike.

Together, these three programs highlighted Farhang Foundation's commitment to presenting immersive, multidisciplinary cultural experiences that connect Iranian art, music, and tradition with contemporary audiences.



# THE LEGACY OF THE SHIRAZ ART FESTIVAL

UCLA's Iranian Music Conference Series presented THE LEGACY OF THE SHIRAZ ART FESTIVAL, an online panel discussion exploring the historical significance and enduring impact of the Shiraz Festival of Arts. Held annually from 1967 to 1977 in Shiraz and Persepolis, Iran, the festival was initiated by Empress Farah Pahlavi to foster cultural exchange between Eastern and Western arts. The panel featured Dr. Shahab Paranj, director of UCLA's Iranian Music program, conductor, and educator, known for integrating Iranian and Western composition techniques; Dr. Vali Mahlouji, art curator and founder of the nonprofit platform Archaeology of the Final Decade (AOTFD), who has contributed to institutions like the Guggenheim Museum and LACMA; and Dr. Josh Charney, musicologist, pianist, and composer, whose research focuses on the Shiraz Arts Festival as a cultural model for democracy and identity in prerevolutionary Iran. This insightful discussion shed light on the festival's role in bridging cultural divides and its lasting influence on the global arts landscape.

From June 14 to June 30, 2024, Farhang Foundation, in partnership with the UCLA Film & Television Archive, proudly presented the annual UCLA Celebration of Iranian Cinema at the Billy Wilder Theater in Los Angeles's Hammer Museum. This esteemed series showcased a diverse selection of feature-length and short films from Iran and the Iranian diaspora, celebrating the resilience, creativity, and artistic vision of Iranian filmmakers.

The program opened with the Los Angeles premiere of **JOONAM**, directed by **Sierra Urich**, a poignant documentary exploring identity and heritage through three generations of Iranian women living in the diaspora. The festival also included the world restoration premiere of **THE SEALED SOIL** (1977), directed by **Marva Nabili**, a landmark work as the first feature film directed by an Iranian woman.

Other screenings featured CAUSE OF DEATH:

UNKNOWN, directed by Maryam Zaree, an investigative documentary examining global pharmaceutical practices; ROXANA, directed by Parviz Shahbazi, which portrays young Iranians navigating societal challenges; and EMPTY NETS (2023), directed by Behrooz Karamizade, a compelling story of love and sacrifice set against the backdrop of economic hardship.

The lineup also included **ACHILLES**, directed by **Farnoosh Samadi**, a powerful narrative addressing social dilemmas; **DARK MATTER**, directed by **Kiarash Anvari**, exploring themes of existentialism and displacement; and **IN THE LAND OF BROTHERS**, directed by **Arash Nassiri**, a surrealistic depiction of familial bonds and nostalgia.

Through these screenings, the festival offered audiences an unparalleled glimpse into the multifaceted world of Iranian cinema, underscoring Farhang Foundation's dedication to promoting Iranian art and culture.

The 15th Annual Farhang Foundation Short Film Festival kicked off on April 29, inviting filmmakers worldwide to submit short films that explore aspects of Iranian culture and heritage. A record-breaking number of submissions were accepted until July 29, 2024, with entries evaluated for creativity, quality, and originality. The festival offered prizes of \$10,000 for first place, \$5,000 for second place, and \$3,000 for third place, along with global recognition through Farhang Foundation's promotional campaigns. The top six selections were announced in September 2024, culminating in an awards ceremony on September 28, 2024, at UCLA's Schoenberg Hall. The esteemed 2024 jury included Mark Amin, Lily Amir-Arjomand, Zar Amir, Ahmad Kiarostami, Noora Niasari, Niousha Noor, and Shabnam Tolouei. The red-carpet award ceremony was hosted by comedian Melissa Shoshahi and featured special guest presenters including Lily Amir-Arjomand, the visionary founder of Iran's Institute for the Intellectual Development of Children and Young Adults. The evening concluded with an after-party celebrating the filmmakers, featuring music by DJ Arin.

# Nicky Nodjoumi The Personal Is Political

#### Nahid Hagigat Etched in Time at YBCA

Farhang Foundation proudly launched its inaugural exhibition in San Francisco in partnership with the Yerba Buena Center for the Arts (YBCA), presenting two interconnected solo exhibitions: NICKY NODJOUMI: THE PERSONAL IS POLITICAL and NAHID HAGIGAT: ETCHED IN TIME. Curated by Amy Kisch, these exhibitions offered an investigative portrait of a family of artists whose creative expressions are deeply intertwined with political revolution. Nodjoumi's surreal and kaleidoscopic paintings explore manifestations of political power, while Hagigat's evocative etchings focus on women and the ongoing struggle for freedom. The exhibitions were complemented by family photos and archival materials that shed light on the personal and shared struggles that have shaped their artistic practices. Additionally, a previously unexhibited 1972 animation by Nodjoumi was on display, addressing issues that continue to affect global communities today. The exhibition featured curated programming by Farhang Foundation throughout its five-month run from October 6, 2024, through March 23, 2025.

The University of Southern California's Iranian Studies Initiative continued the annual Farhang Foundation Lecture Series with the presentation of SURVIVAL BY DESIGN: DESERT ARCHITECTURE AND THE END OF THE WORLD, a lecture by visiting guest professor Pamela Karimi of Cornell University. Held at USC's **Doheny Memorial Library**, the lecture explored the sustainable architectural practices developed over centuries in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) to adapt to harsh desert environments. Professor Karimi examined how these ecofriendly methods were often dismissed by colonial powers and eroded with the twentieth century's reliance on fossil fuels and modern technologies. The discussion highlighted imaginative proposals for self-sustained disaster shelters and lunar settlements inspired by MENA's desert designs, contrasting wellfunded projects by US experts with innovative contributions from marginalized figures like Iranian American architect Nader Khalili. By exploring various case studies, the lecture challenged the notion that environmental design solutions in the age of accelerated global warming are exclusively the domain of white/Euro-American expertise, emphasizing the enduring relevance and ingenuity of traditional Iranian desert architecture. This annual lecture series provides a great opportunity for USC to invite renowned Iranian scholars to campus for both student and public lectures.

Farhang Foundation was delighted to join forces with the AMERICAN CINEMATHEQUE in presenting a special screening of living legend Bahram Beyzaie's fully restored masterpiece THE STRANGER AND THE FOG. This event featured a new 4K restoration of the film, accompanied by an introduction from Cinema Rex's Faran Moradi and Kaveh Mohebbi. Originally released in 1976, THE STRANGER AND THE FOG is a seminal work of the Iranian New Wave cinema, blending mythic storytelling with a dreamlike atmosphere. The narrative follows Ayat, a wounded stranger who arrives in a coastal village with no memory of his past, and explores themes of identity and destiny. Bahram Beyzaie, an award-winning filmmaker, theater director, and scholar, has been instrumental in revitalizing Iranian performing arts by integrating Iranian mythology with modern theater and cinema. His extensive body of work includes more than seventy publications and numerous films and plays.

## Voices in Shadow:

The Artistic Journey of Iranian Female Singers After the Revolution

Presented as part of the UCLA Iranian Music Conference Series, Voices in Shadow offered a powerful and thought-provoking exploration of the artistic, technical, and societal challenges faced by Iranian female vocalists in the aftermath of the 1979 revolution, which banned solo performances by women in Iran.

Moderated by composer and music scholar Dr. Shahab Paranj, the panel featured renowned Iranian singers Maliheh Moradi, Sahar Boroujerdi, and Mahbobeh Golzari, who reflected on their personal journeys as artists working under systemic restrictions. The discussion highlighted the loss of public platforms, the disrupted transmission of traditional vocal techniques, and the resilience of female performers who continue to preserve and share Iranian classical music around the world.

In addition to storytelling and scholarly insight, the panel included live vocal demonstrations, offering attendees a rare glimpse into the refined techniques and interpretive depth of Iranian singing. Through historical context and artistic testimony, the event illuminated the enduring creativity and cultural contributions of Iranian women in music despite decades of censorship.

The series concluded on January 26 with **ROXANA**, a compelling portrait of disaffected youth in Tehran, caught between personal desire and social constraint.

Beyond the cinematic experience, attendees also had the opportunity to explore two powerful solo exhibitions by Iranian artists **Nicky Nodjoumi** and **Nahid Hagigat**, which were concurrently on view at YBCA. The weekend brought together both Iranian and non-Iranian community members to engage with contemporary Iranian storytelling and visual culture in a dynamic and meaningful way.

"I am deeply honored and thrilled to have my design selected for this year's Farhang Nowruz campaign," said Rahnama. It is my hope that this design brings joy and inspiration to everyone as we celebrate Nowruz together."
